Director Langer asked for nominations for chairperson for the July 18, 2022 meeting.

Comm. Ald. Stockman nominated Comm. Reed to serve as the chairperson for the July 18, 2022 meeting. Comm. Snow seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Approve Agenda

Comm. Ald. Stockman motioned to approve the agenda. Comm. Hare seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Approval Of Minutes - May 16, 2022

Comm. Hare motioned to approve the minutes. Comm. Purdy seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Discussion And Possible Action On King Park Disc Golf Sign

Discussion And Possible Action On Paint Color For Lamar Park Pavilion

Comm. Hare motioned to paint the pavilion trim red, the top half white, and the bottom half black. Comm. Ald. Stockman seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Jacob Streeter requested a comment be added to the meeting that he would request additional sidewalk along the north boundary line of South Goodrich Park south of Milton East Elementary School between Parkview Drive and Janesville Street. Mr. Streeter also expressed appreciation for the recently installed sidewalk along Janesville Street in South Goodrich Park.

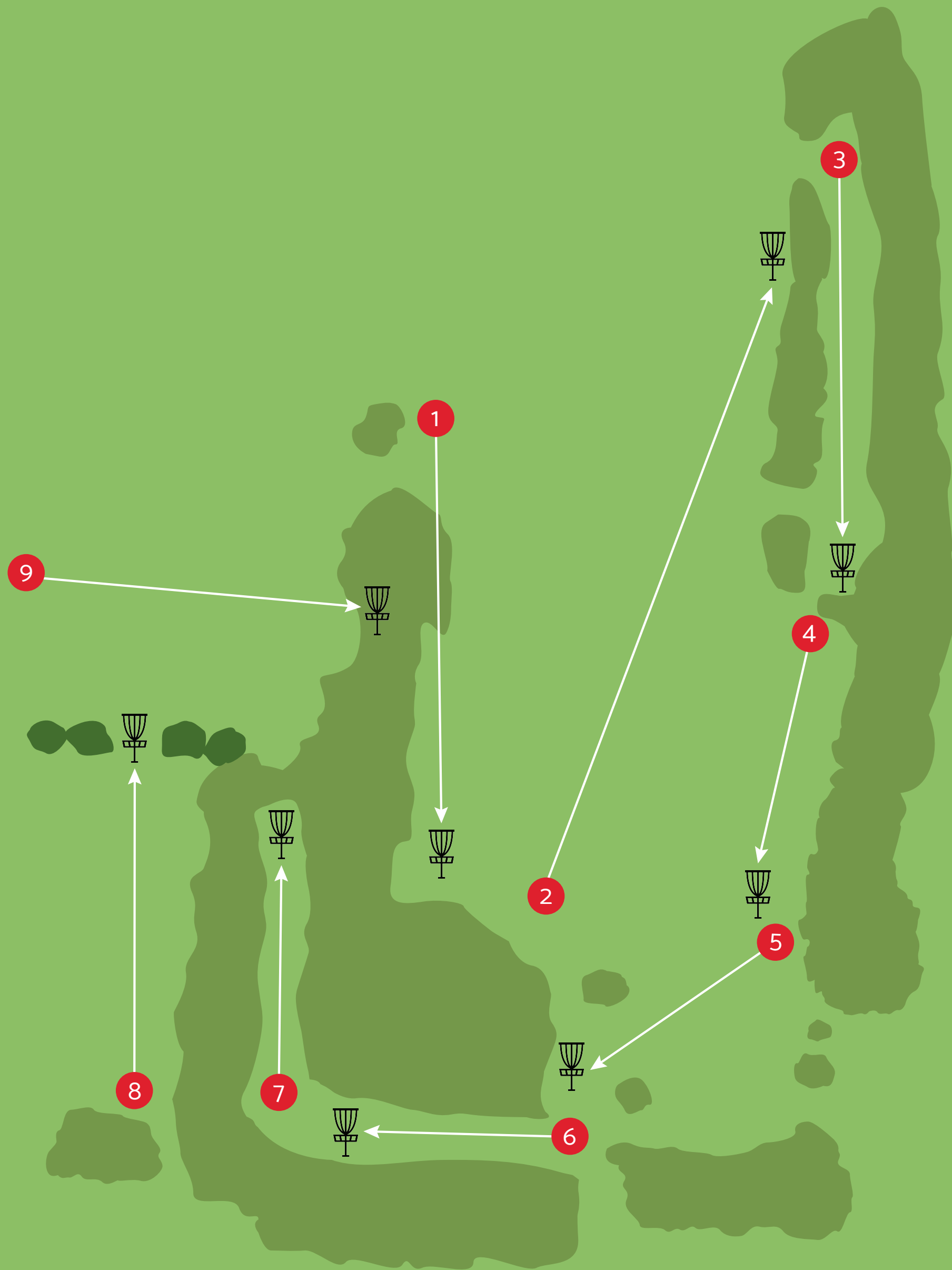

HOW TO PLAY DISC GOLF

The object of the game is to complete the course in the fewest throws of the disc.



1. Start from the teeing area. The player must throw from behind the front of the teeing area.
2. Subsequent throws are played from behind the spot where the previous throw came to rest. This spot is known as the "lie." If your disc comes to rest in a tree or bush, the lie is a spot on the ground directly below.
3. A run-up and follow through are allowed, but the player must release the disc before stepping past the lie.
4. A putt is a short range throw. When putting within 10 meters of the target, you must not step past the lie before establishing balance behind it.
5. The hole is completed when the disc comes to a rest in the basket or chains. The hole is not completed if the disc is resting on top of the target.
6. If a throw goes out-of-bounds: play from either the last in-bounds location with 1-throw penalty or retee with 1-throw penalty.
