Summary

Staff was notified by United Way Blackhawk Region that Diamond Assets was interested in sponsoring a Born Learning Trail in Milton. In consultation with the Parks & Recreation Commission, Crossridge Park was chosen as the location.

Analysis and Key Issues

A full description of Born Learning Trails is included as an attachment. Volunteers on United Way Blackhawk Region's Annual Day of Caring on September 14 will paint the artwork associated with each of the 10 signs that Public Works will be installing for the trail. The trail will start near the entrance to the Crossridge Park trail from the public parking lot near the Parker YMCA and continue to where the trail intersects with the loop around the northern portion of the park. Public Works coordinated seal coating of this section of the trail in order to provide a clean surface for the artwork to be added.

Fiscal Impact

The cost to seal coat this section of the trail was approximately \$700. The remaining costs are covered by the sponsorship from Diamond Assets.

Recommended Motion

To accept the donation of a Born Learning Trail from United Way Blackhawk Region and Diamond Assets.
