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### Summary

Derek Henze along with Tyler Olson on behalf of Open Doors Foundation has applied for a Temporary Class “B” picnic license for the 2022 Milton Farmer’s Market held in North Goodrich Park.

### Analysis and Key Issues

The 2022 Milton Farmers Market will be held in North Goodrich Park on May 12, June 9, August 11, September 8, and October 6 from 4:00 p.m. and continue until 7:30 p.m. The Farmer’s Market in July will be held in conjunction with the 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration and will not be part of this license. Open Doors Foundation would like to serve fermented malt beverages “beer” in an enclosed area of the market during the open hours.

By Ordinance Sec. 50-115 (b) fermented malt beverages and wine is allowed to be consumed at the Community house but does not allow consumption in North Goodrich Park.

If the Council approves alcohol consumption in North Goodrich Park, staff recommends requiring the same access controls as those required at the Fourth of July celebration at Schilberg Park:

- The enclosed area permitting alcohol consumption shall be designated by a fence to clearly identify the area where alcohol consumption is permitted and restricted to.
- The fence shall have a single entrance and exit point monitored by event staff.
- On entry, event staff will check identification to determine the age of the entrant. No one under the age of 21 will be allowed in the fenced area.
- On exit, event staff will ensure no alcohol is carried out of the permitted area into the park.
- At least one licensed operator will need to be onsite during the time alcohol is served.



**Fiscal Impact**

The event does require the use of City resources and labor for the time to provide and set-up barricades. This work will be performed by City crews during normal working hours as not to incur overtime.
